*Our National Partnership Plans for 2011 have been presented to the Department of Education and have been approved. Hmmmm, they tasted so good!



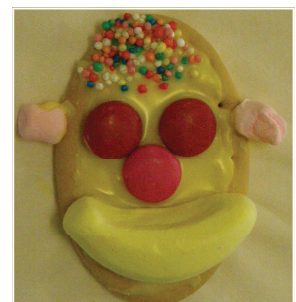

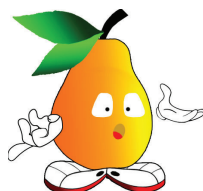
