#### Thank you, Cross Country Competitors...

Miss Lyon and Miss Dragicevich had the pleasure of escorting our students to the carnival. Not only did they display an appropriate competitive attitude and try their best, but they also encouraged others who were having difficulty in completing the running course. They not only supported students in need from our own school, but also from other schools in attendance. They should be highly commended for this behaviour, as many students from other schools were doing the exact opposite, and were intimidating and teasing students in difficulty. Well done to the students of Edensor Park, we are very proud of you. You have proven once again that you are excellent citizens in our school and community and you know the true meaning of sportsmanship.

#### Inclosed Lands Protection Act...

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents and community members that there are certain expectations that all adults and visitors to the school must adhere to when they enter the school grounds:

- Adults must not approach children (other than their own) on school grounds
- Adults must not disrupt the classroom environment of the students
- Adults must not act in a manner that is deemed to be aggressive verbally or physically
- Parents and members of the community must not approach any staff member in an aggressive or threatening manner – verbally or physically

Under the provisions of the Inclosed Lands Protection Act, "Principals have the capacity to restrict the entry of persons who behave in a manner in the presence of students, staff, parents or other visitors to the school that could reasonably be expected to cause alarm or concern to the students, staff, parents or other visitors". The Inclosed Lands Protection Act also covers instances "when people persistently interrupt the learning environment of the school by entering classrooms without permission". I encourage all parents and community members to be mindful that the school is a child centred environment, and the safety and wellbeing of the students is a priority under our duty of care.

### Please report to the office...

I remind parents that all visitors to the school, including parents, must report to the office during school time. Parents with an issue of concern or seeking clarification or information from teachers, should make an appropriate appointment time with the class teacher, or member of the executive, for the matter to be dealt with, without causing disruption to the school organisation or class routines. This will also allow for an appropriate amount of time and concern to be allocated to the matter.

#### Thinking about Thinking...

We have another great learning opportunity available to our parents on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> June from 6.00pm to 7.30pm. This workshop will be run by Miss Moisidis who is currently working with all students and teachers across the school to increase and maintain student engagement. The workshop promises to be full of interesting information around the way in which the human brain works, and how children can be engaged in their learning through understanding their learning styles and thinking preferences. We look forward to seeing you at this workshop, to find out how our students are being engaged in the classrooms.

The 2011 seasonal influenza vaccine contains (swine flu) pandemic A(H1N1), seasonal A(H3N2) and B strains. While these are the same strains used in the 2010 influenza vaccine, people are still encouraged to receive this year's

20th June - 1st July 2011


Swimming classes for students in Yrs 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 are being conducted from Monday,  $20^{th}$  June until Friday,  $1^{st}$  July 2011, in school time, at Prairiewood Leisure Centre. This year, the children will be attending the 1:45-2:30 session.
