

For the past couple of weeks, 3/4D has been working on bridges! One of our tasks was to write a procedure on how to make a groovy bridge with paddle pop sticks. We watched a YouTube tutorial which gave us step by step instructions on how to make something which looks like the following.

How to Make a Paddle Pop Stick Bridge

What we need

Hot glue gun (and electricity)

Paddle pop sticks

Method

- 1. Take three paddle pop sticks
- 2. Make a triangle using the three paddle pop sticks and glue them together
- 3. Repeat step 2 six times.
- 4. Glue the six triangles together.
- 5. Make a square using the paddle pop sticks, and glue it together
- 6. Make triangles within the square
- 7. Repeat this process so you have two squares for the top piece and three for the bottom.
- 8. Flatten any weak sticks.
- 9. Put all the pieces together.

Procedure- How to Make a Paddle Pop Stick Bridge

Materials

Hot glue gun

Electricity

Paddle pop sticks

Method

- Step 1: Take three paddle pop sticks away.
- Step 2: Put your three paddle pop sticks in a triangle shape.
- Step 3: Glue the three paddle pop sticks in a triangle shape and then repeat the process six times.
- Step 4: Connect the triangles together by three and then do the same thing with the others.
- Step 5: You can also put spare paddle pop sticks in between them for more support.
- Step 6: So now with the base of the bridge, get four paddle pop sticks and glue them together in a square shape.
- Step 7: Get two paddle pop sticks and make a V sign, then glue the V shape in middle of the square.
- Step 8: Repeat this process five times.
- Step 9: If your pieces are wobbly, get a thick book and flatten them out by putting a book on top of them.
- Step 10: Put glue on each of the corners of the squares and start combining them together.

How to Make a Paddle Pop Stick Bridge

What we need

Paddle pop sticks

Electricity

Glue gun

What to do

- 1. Take three paddle pop sticks away.
- 2. Make a triangle using these paddle pop sticks.
- 3. Repeat this same step six times.
- 4. Connect the triangles together.
- 5. Put extra paddle pop sticks in between the triangles to make your bridge stronger.
- 6. Make three squares.
- 7. Take two more paddle pop sticks and glue them inside the squares so it looks like a triangle.
- 8. Repeat step 6 and 7 and glue the squares together.
- 9. If your squares are wobbly, get a book and flatten them down.
- 10. Put glue on the squares and glue the triangles onto the squares.

How to Make a Paddle Pop Stick Bridge

What you need

Electricity

Hot glue gun

Paddle pop sticks

Steps

- 1. Take three paddle pop sticks away.
- 2. Make a triangle using the paddle pop sticks.
- 3. Repeat this step six times.
- 4. Connect the triangles from the top.
- 5. Add more sticks if you want your bridge to be stable.
- 6. Create three squares for the bottom piece with the hot glue gun and paddle pop sticks.
- 7. Take two other paddle pop sticks to make a triangle inside the square.
- 8. Now, moving on to the top piece, repeat step 7 two times.
- 9. If your pieces are wobbly, flatten them with a heavy item.
- 10. Put glue on each corner and assemble pieces together.

How to Make a Paddle Pop Stick Bridge

Materials

Paddle pop sticks

Hot glue gun

Electricity

Glue tube

Method

- 1. Take three paddle pop sticks away.
- 2. Make a triangle using the three paddle pop sticks.
- 3. Glue the triangle together from each side using the hot glue gun, and repeat this step six times.
- 4. Grab three more triangles and glue them together from the top, and repeat one more time.
- 5. Now, starting with the bottom piece you would want to make three squares using four paddle pop sticks.
- 6. Take two paddle pop sticks and glue them onto the square (as a triangle shape).
- 7. Now, moving on to the top piece, grab two squares and repeat this process twice.
- 8. If your pieces are wobbly, use a thick book to balance it.
- 9. You are almost finished, you just need to assemble it altogether!

How to Make a Paddle Pop Stick Bridge

Resources

Paddle pop sticks

Hot glue gun and glue stick

Electric outlet

Method

- 1. Take three paddle pop sticks.
- 2. Make a triangle with the paddle pop sticks.
- 3. Use the glue gun to keep paddle pop sticks together and repeat six times.
- 4. Connect three triangles with paddle pop sticks on top with the glue gun only and connect at the bottom. [Optional] You can weave with paddle pop sticks to make it stronger.
- 5. Use four paddle pop sticks to make a square, repeat five times.
- 6. Use two paddle pop sticks to make a triangle on the square to reinforce it, and repeat with two squares.
- 7. If parts are wobbly, use heavy items to flatten the parts.
- 8. Put three squares and glue them together, repeat the process with two other squares.
- 9. Get the three assembled squares and put glue on the corner of the squares.
- 10. Put the two side parts on the glue.
- 11. Then put two assembled squares, glue together and glue onto the sides.
- 12. Enjoy your bridge.
