KN had lots of fun programming and learning directional language through the use of the Bee-Bot.


What is a Bee-Bot?

Bee-Bots are programmable floor robots.



Bright buttons for the students to use to input instructions.

The ability to remember up to 40 instructions/ steps entered by students.



The ability to move accurately in 15cm steps and to turn in 90 degree increments.

Sounds and flashing eyes that let students know that their instructions have been entered.

Miss Najdovski was very proud of KN and how quickly they learnt to use

the Bee-Bot. Students had to program the Bee-Bot to move around the floor mat sending it to different destinations.
