Reconciliation Week

From the 27th May to the 3rd June our school hosted Reconciliation Week. Reconciliation means taking the steps to repair broken relationships and to try and make up for wrong doings. During colonisation, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were greatly mistreated and suffered terrible losses. For many years after, the Australian government supported laws that were unfair and discriminatory.

Therefore, Reconciliation Week was introduced by the Council of Aboriginal Reconciliation in 1996. The initiative was introduced to help our nation create a future based on strong positive relationships between the wider community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

The dates of reconciliation mark two significant milestones in Australia's history.

On the 27th May 1967, more than 90% of Australians voted to change laws to include Aboriginal people and to acknowledge them as citizens and on the 3rd June 1992, the High Court of Australia delivered the Mabo decision. The Mabo decision acknowledged Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as Traditional Owners and Custodians of the land. These events help recognise the value of Aborginal and Torres Strait Islander. The people of Australia strongly believe in reconciliation that in 2001 over 300,000 people walked across Sydney Harbour Bridge to show their support for reconciliation. At school, to show our support students learnt about Aboriginal customs, traditions and the Dreamtime. Each student created artworks, watched YouTube clips, and read books on Aboriginal culture. By participating in these lessons students get to learn more about Australia's first people and to appreciate their importance to Australia's future.


